Treasurer's Report – Ben Tilghman

With 75% of the fiscal year completed, income stands at 74%, while expenses are at 71% of budget. If income and expenses continue as is for the fourth quarter, we should finish the year on budget, if not a bit under. While utilities expenses are projected to be considerably over budget by FY end, income from facilities use has projected to more than offset the increased expense. We continue to support PYM with our annual covenant payment of \$17,000.

A friend noted that we have had monies (\$1,806.68) on the balance sheet as "funds temporarily held, Carriage Shed Sale" for several years, and suggested that we should use the funds for the benefit of the Meeting. Meeting agreed that the money should be transferred to the Scholarship Fund for use to be determined, but most likely in support of First Day School/Summer Camp.

Clerks are reminded that May marks the beginning of the formal budget process for FY23-24, and that they will be hearing from the Treasurer to prepare their budget requests for the next fiscal year. Beginning next week clerks will receive a YTD statement and 3-4 years of history. Please figure out what your needs will be for the coming year. Contact the treasurer if further information is desired.

In addition, we need to think about how we will support new infrastructure if we build a new building. Our income wouldn't cover what the Trustees now cover, so we need to consider how to increase income for future expenses.
